## What's In a Name?

Do you know why our Lodge is called "Fedrelandet"? It literally means "fatherland" as in mother country or "the homeland." History of the fraternal side of the Sons of Norway organization is rooted in sponsorship back in the day. As with most countries, Norwegian immigrants needed American citizens to sponsor them in case issues came up, and we also had a lot of migrant workers - men who would work in the fishing industry and either send their money back home to their families or bring it back with them every few years. Our lodge (building) was really the only large gathering place our community had, so of course it was the location most connection to the "motherland." By the second generation, ties to the old country were starting to fade so our local Lodge was/is where most learn the culture they identify with. Our lodge was the 23rd that formally organized, so we became Fedrelandet #23, and we belong to the 2nd District in the Sons of Norway organization. Thanks to Glo Wollen for the history lesson!

The Lodge parade Banner - a 6' x 3' red nylon banner announcing our lodge "Fedrelandet #23" is missing. It traditionally leads the lodge members following right behind the Valhalla ship in the Sytennde Mai parade at the Little Norway Festival. ## Members Corner - An interview with Roxy Lee

- Q How long have you been a member of Sons of Norway?
- A-I've been a member for over 50 years. My husband Harold was a member before me. His father (also Harold) came over from Norway to Petersburg in 1902. He was one of the original members.
- Q Why did you join Sons of Norway?
- A-It was a good social outing and a great opportunity to share wonderful meals with old friends and welcome new friends.



- Q If you could change one thing about our lodge, what would it be?
- A-I think I really have two things. First, we need to do more to encourage younger members to get involved. Second, we need to recognize the members who work with our kids (for example our dancers) as well as the kids who participate.
- Q What do you like best about being a member?
- A-It keeps our traditions alive by our older members sharing their "How To" do things. For example: How to make lefse, how to make krumkake, and how to say or sing our prayer in Norwegian.

## THE RUNESTONE RECIPE BOX

## Scandinavian Almond Bars

From the collection of Sally Dwyer

These are great cookies when you are in a hurry and need them quickly, they look nice too! Yum! A favorite at the Dwyer's.


1-3/4 cups flour 2 tsp. baking powder

½ cup butter, softened 1-cup sugar

1 egg ½ tsp. almond extract

½ tsp. salt ½ cup sliced almonds, broken up a bit

Milk Almond Icing (see below)



Divide dough into 4 equal sections. Form each portion into a 12" long roll. Place 2 rolls 3-4 inches apart on an ungreased cookie sheet. Flatten each roll until it is approx. 2" wide, repeat with other 2 rolls on another pan. Brush flattened rolls lightly with milk and sprinkle with broken, sliced almonds. Bake one sheet at a time for 12-15 minutes or until just golden on the edges. Let sit 3-5 minutes then slice about 3/4-1" wide on the diagonal. (I use a pizza cutter.) Transfer to wire racks and cool. When cool, drizzle with icing (I put a sheet of waxed paper underneath to catch the extra).

Almond Icing - mix the following to drizzling consistency, but not too runny

3/4 cup powdered sugar ½ tsp. almond extract

2-4 tsp. milk

I put the glaze in a baggie and cut the tip off, then drizzle in a zigzagging all-over motion. Let them set, break apart if needed and store in an airtight container, separating the layers with waxed paper.






## **Sons of Norway District Information**
