## Letter from the President

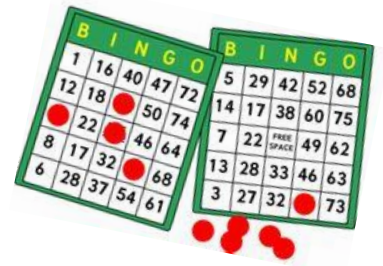

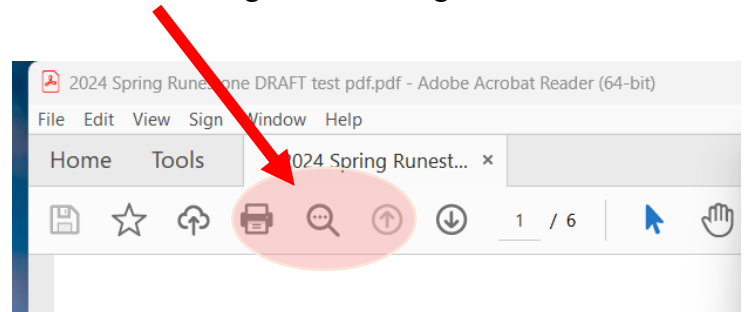


## How Does Our Lodge Make Events Happen??

## **Member's Corner :**

### **An interview with Dave and Sally Reimer**

**Q** - How long have you been members of Sons of Norway?

**A** – *We moved to Petersburg in 1977, and the community didn't even have a radio station at that time. Before Dave accepted a position with the Forest Service, we had an agreement that we would only stay here for two years, and then move back to Columbus, Ohio. Well, that didn't exactly work out as we're still here. We have loved our time in Petersburg.*

*We've only been members of the Sons of Norway for 15 years. When we first moved here, we didn't know we could join, since we aren't Norwegian. When we joined the Lutheran Church, folks started asking us why we weren't members. It was at that point we realized the Sons of Norway was about community and learning about Norwegian history and customs. Needless to say, we then joined.*



**Q** – Why did you join Sons of Norway?

**A** – *We enjoyed the people. We saw how hard they worked but also how much fun they were having. We saw all of the good things the organization was doing for the community by bringing everyone together, getting the kids involved, and caring for the historic building.*

**Q** – If you could change one thing about our Lodge, what would it be?

**A** – *We need to reach out and get more young people involved. We need to share more about Norwegian heritage, and ensure everyone knows they are invited and welcome. It's not only about the Norwegian heritage, but it's about what kind of community we want for ourselves and our children. We want to continue coming together as "good friends" to share a community meal. We also miss seeing the adult's Norwegian dancing.*

**Q** – What do you like best about being a member?

**A** – *It may seem strange to say but it's our building - the pride in maintaining it for future generations. Our daughter's wedding reception was the second one held there, so that adds to our desire to maintain the building. We love the improvements and how the building is being used today.*

# THE RUNESTONE RECIPE BOX

## Almond Wedges

From the collection of Sally Dwyer

Preheat oven 325 degrees

1 cup (2 cubes) of softened butter

1 whole egg

2-1/4 cups flour

1 egg white

1-1/2 cups sugar

1 egg yolk

2 Tbsp (yes) almond extract

1/3-1/2 cup sliced almonds, broken up

Cream butter, sugar, egg, and egg yolk well. Add almond extract. Add flour all at once. Spread in 2 lightly greased (I spray with Pam w/flour) pie pans. Beat egg white until foamy with a fork or a tiny milk frother (I use this), brush top of dough and sprinkle evenly with crunched up almonds.

Bake 30 minutes at 325 degrees. Let cool. Remove carefully from pans and cut into 16 wedges each, for a total of 32 wedges. (I use my ham knife that reaches all the way across). Rich and chewy.

Can you change it up? Sure! I have been on the committee since 2002 and am stepping down. I am also on the Smorbrod committee so I will stick with that, as I am finding that I need to concentrate on one fine thing and not get too spread out. - ❖ Do you have a talent you want to share? A short class we could host for the members? Or a topic you think we would enjoy at one of our potlucks? Or a simple cross stitch ornament kit we could order, or a woven heart class or a potholder made from a blue jean pocket? We have lots of talent out there in the Lodge!



## **Honey-Do & Wish List for 2024**

- 1) Sand, stain and varnish five old square tables. We use these at nearly all our functions and they are pretty beat up – they need some tender loving care (TLC)! One has been done by Suzanne Fuqua.
- 2) Sand, stain and varnish four podiums. We use these at all meetings and around the hall all year.
- 3) Weather stripping on door to the left of the stage into the back hall is falling off.
- 4) Treat the entire main floor with Bona, a highly recommended wood treatment. This will take 5-6 people to work as a team using Bona pads on sticks, and moving together to apply it in swaths on the floor. The



pads are approximately 12-14" wide, so many people working together will take less time than one person slogging on by themselves.

- 5) Attach a brass grab handle to the exit door, back left side, in the main hall.
- 6) Repair ice-torn roofing before the rain rots the under-roof wood. Mike Luhr has roofing we can bum/buy. Carolyn and Kurt Kvernvik are the leads on this, but might need help
- 7) Go through the stuff on the side porch. It cannot all be treasures. Trustees?
- 8) Weatherize the side porch with plexiglass for storage options and building protection.
- 9) Paint all interior doors that are scuffed up.
- 10) Build a small, locked closet in the entry coat area for storage of paper products, soaps etc.
- 11) Replace the flooring in the furnace room in a dark shade - less wear and tear.
- 12) Power wash the Park as needed. Put flower beds to sleep.
- 13) Possibly have Polly Koeneman and Sally Dwyer repaint the bench rosemaling for next year.
- 14) Put wires across the outside windows in the main hall and kitchen to keep the pigeons off the ledge and messing up the windows.
- 15) Paint the kitchen floor in Bingoland as it is falling apart, stained 70+ years ago. Hoping this will suffice until we can afford to rehab and remodel the kitchen.



Thanks to Wendel Gilbert and Dave for replacing the carpet on the front porch – looks great!
